The Alice B Rapoport Center at Goodman Theatre Chicago, IL

(In-Progress) Project Architect

The Goodman Theatre expansion (10,000sf adjacent to the Goodman Theatre) when completed in Spring 2016 will allow for the expansion of the theatre's community engagement and education programs. LEED-CI certification (anticipated)

Chicago Urban League Outreach Center Chicago, IL (In-Progress) Project Architect

The center for Human Capital Development in the Back of the Yards neighborhood will allow the Chicago Urban League to their outreach programs to African American boys and men providing them with the tools needed for an improved quality of life.

Butler College Prep Chicago, IL 2013-2015, Project Architect

The 67,000sf phased co-share of a new Noble Network of Charter Schools campus into Corliss High School-CPS. This campus provides an under-served neighborhood with an alternative to the traditional high school experience.

Wolcott School Chicago, IL 2011-2013, Project Architect

Conceived by a local grassroots not-for-profit, Wolcott School opened in 2013 as the Chicago region's only high-school tailored to the strengths and aspirations of students with Learning Differences. The facility incorporates the James Tyree Community Resource Center, which offers educational seminars and shares best practices with special educators and parents from school districts throughout the entire region.

Inspiration Kitchens Chicago, IL 2009-2011, Project Architect

7,300 sq. ft. facility with a 80 seat restaurant that serves subsidized meals to working poor families and market rate meals to the general public; a combination service, catering and training kitchen from which a 13 week food service training program is conducted. The facility has a sustainable garden that supplies fresh herbs and vegetables for the restaurant and serves as an educational resource for students, local school children and the community. Complete renovation of a brick and wood frame single family residence built in 1870s located on a landmarked street in Chicago's Old Town neighborhood.

synopsis The adaptive reuse of a 1926 Union League Boys and Girls Club building into Chicago's first high school

dedicated to students with learning differences. Designed as the antithesis to "one-size-fits-all" school buildings, Wolcott supports individual learning styles in a community environment. Classrooms are partnered with one or more semi-private huddle rooms and common collaborative areas. Significant interior historical building elements were saved, including three original fireplaces stacked in the center of the building which become common areas for collaborative learning around traditional worktops or informal social seating. A former windowless swimming pool and paved play lot is transformed into a light-filled multi-purpose room facing a new garden. To counter the formality of the traditional entry, the garden was designed to act as an inviting alternative entry for the students, some of whom have struggled

with negative associations of conventional schooling.

synopsis Built in the 1870's, this two-story brick and wood frame single family residence is located in a landmark

district of Chicago. Although exterior changes visible from the street are restricted by landmark guidelines, the project included a complete gut renovation of the interior and the removal of a 1980's two-story addition in the rear yard. The newly opened interior space is defined and vertically connected by a central two-story volume that is naturally lit from a series of skylights above. The central volume contains the home's service spaces and is carved to reveal an open stair whose landing extends to form the kitchen counter. A wall of cabinetry on the west complements the stark gallery wall on the east. The large south-facing opening extends the living space into the garden and provides natural light and views deep within

the house.















First Floor Plan







Second Floor Plan





synopsis Located in Chicago's Gold Coast neighborhood in a former hotel, this penthouse apartment for a family of

five was designed to balance intimate spaces for family with social spaces for guests. The main residence is located on the 12th floor which was previously the mechanical penthouse with 12-13 foot high ceilings and sweeping views south (downtown Chicago), East (Lake Michigan) and West. The owner's love of contemporary art and vibrant textiles had a significant impact on the apartments' detailing, including millwork, lighting and finish materials. As a result, the architecture is a "neutral" container allowing the occupant to focus on the art and furnishings. The main architectural element is the spiral stair in the entry foyer which connects the main floor common spaces (Kitchen, Dining Rm, Living Room and Study) and

bedrooms to the 13th floor family/guest room and exterior terrace.











2nd Floor Plan




Detail 1 Plan Detail First Level Detail 2 Plan Detail First Level

synopsis Located on the second floor of a 15 story office tower, originally designed by legendary architect William

LeBarron Jenney, this classically designed steel frame structure provided the perfect shell for an office/studio for a graphic design firm. The 4200 sf space was designed to support a collaborative open studio environment, conference spaces and office support space. Large windows, high ceilings and restored plaster ornament from the original structure provide contrast for the newly constructed space defined by floating planes, lighting, and utilitarian elements. Bright white walls and ceiling act as light reflecting

surfaces to illuminate true color of graphic work and presentations.



theatre's community engagement and education programs to teachers, teenagers and seniors from across the City. Envisioned as a space which immerses the user "within the trees", a double sided acoustical wood slatted folding wall forms the outer face of each learning space and reception area, concrete columns are left exposed to "puncture the clouds" i.e. ceiling via a 6" reveal around each column at the ceiling. It center will include two rehearsal labs, a STEM learning lab, a reception space and additional support spaces all designed with sophisticated audio visual equipment, lighting (both natural and artificial) and

acoustics.



a culinary training and catering kitchen, and an 80 seat restaurant. Prior to its current use, the building housed a company which manufactured parts for metal working lathes, and most recently a storage facility with no functioning utilities. The lots were developed into a sustainable garden for the restaurant and an educational resource for the community, stormwater retention reservoir, and a vegetated trellis shading the restaurant dining area. The building is now a place where trainees alter the trajectory of their

lives and local families enjoy nutritious meals in Chicago's largest food desert.









Before: Warehouse interior prior to renovation; Existing sawtooth roof












