As a part of AIA Chicago's 150th anniversary celebration, the AIA Chicago Foundation has launched the AIA Chicago Diversity Scholarship Initiative: An opportunity to support students who will become talented young professionals in a more diverse Chicago community, recognizing the value of new and unique voices to the profession. The scholarship program stipulates:

- One (1) \$10,000 scholarship for a graduate student, awarded over two years (\$5000/year)
- Eligible graduate students include those enrolling at a NAAB accredited master's degree program at the Illinois Institute of Technology, School of the Art Institute of Chicago or the University of Illinois at Chicago
- Awardee will also receive guidance and ongoing mentorship from AIA Chicago members throughout their educational tenure

**Diversity Definition: The American Institute of Architects recognizes that diversity enhances our membership, our profession, and the quality of life in our communities. Our programs and initiatives shall reflect the society that we serve, regardless of race, gender, sexual orientation, physical abilities, or religious practices. - Portfolio
- One-page resume
- Submit a two three-minute video statement discussing Why architecture, your future career plans and why you should be AIA Chicago Foundation's choice for 2020 Diversity Scholarship.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation; one letter must be from a professor or an employer from a firm related to the practice of architecture or built environment and should address your potential as an architect.
- 500-1000 word statement which addresses fulfillment of the diversity requirements as stated above.
- Submit FAFSA form (if considered a dependent) or your most recent tax document (if considered independent).
